MINUTES

I. Call to Order

The regular meeting of the Merced City and County Continuum of Care (CoC) was called to order at 11:05am on March 2, 2023 via Microsoft Teams by Josh Pedrozo.

II. Roll Call

IV. Public Comment

- Lee Greenawalt states Journey for Justice will now be meeting the second Monday of every month. Next meeting scheduled for March 13th.

V. Consent Agenda Items

Approval needed for this meeting's agenda and February 2, 2023 minutes. Motion from Steve Hammond, second from Josh Pedrozo. None opposed. Motion passed unanimously at 11:12am.

VI. Community Projects

A. ***Merced Navigation Center***

Jennifer Carr stated the Navigation Center currently has 53 participants and nine dogs. Presently sheltering in place due to COVID since February 6th. One more round of testing is scheduled to take place Monday, March 6th; if all tests are negative, shelter in place will be lifted.

Carr also announced an upcoming Navigation Center Community Open House Meeting on March 21st at 10:00am via Zoom. Group was advised to reach out to Jennifer Carr via email if interested in attending.

B. *Emergency Housing Vouchers*

No update given.

C. *Distributive Housing*

David Carr stated Merced currently has 23 beds filled and two open. Los Banos currently has seventeen beds filled and two open. There are plans to bring people in.

D. *Homeless Court*

David Carr stated they have identified and received funding to hire one full-time Housing Court Navigator. One interview has been conducted.

E. *Housing Developments*

John Ceccoli shared that the State's Super NOFA award list was published; City of Merced received \$31 million for 264 units, City of Livingston received \$17 million for affordable housing development of 80 units. so over 340 units of affordable housing received fairly substantial money from HCD through their Super NOFA. This continues a string of success for the City of Merced and their focus on affordable housing.

Childs and B made a significant impact on the community with 30 units being filled through partnership with Behavioral Health and Recovery Services and the Public Housing Authority as they were able to provide 30 Housing Choice Vouchers. Additionally, the developers of this project were heavily involved, as was the Central California Alliance for Health, who provided \$2.5 million in a capital grant.

Matthew Serratto shared updates for the Devinwood and the Parsons and Yosemite Parkway projects. Combined, these projects have a total of 264 units and \$113 million in funding having been committed. The Childs and R and 1213 V Street projects are expected to go live later this year. Other projects in the pipeline include Park Avenue, Gateway Terrance 2, and the seven acre lot at Loughborough and

Ceccoli states a recurring, annual pot of funding for local jurisdictions has been made possible by the Permanent Local Housing Allocation. Six out of seven jurisdictions have applied, five of which were for affordable housing.

Maribel Baron shared with the group Governor Newsom's February announcement of the Super NOFA award list which totaled \$825 million for 58 communities across the State. This will bring about over 9,000 homes, 8,000 of which will be affordable housing for the next decades. Merced was specifically awarded funding for three projects; two are in the City of Merced, totaling \$31 million and 264 units, the third is in the City of Livingston, totaling \$17 million and 80 units. With the way HUD works and the development process, we won't see these projects come to fruition for a few years but this is an incredible advancement for our community.

VII. *Chair Comments*

- Thanks were given to all who participating in the Point in Time Count on February 23rd as it was a huge endeavor. Gratitude also expressed to Phil Schmauss for leading the effort, organizing everything, training everyone, as well as completely and accurately compiling the data afterward.

VIII. *Action Items*

A. *CoC General Membership Applications – General Membership Vote*

Three applications from Love Focus International Association, The Sweet Ethics Residential Association, and Valley Crisis Center were proposed for approval to join the CoC General Membership. No comments or concerns were shared by any in attendance.

Motion from Steve Hammond, second from Elizabeth Benavides. None opposed. Motion passed unanimously at 11:30am.

IX. Board Information & Possible New Action Items

A presentation on the 95-unit 1213 V Street housing project was given by Ryan Wilson, Development Manager at UPHoldings.

X. Reports

A. CA Information Report Out

1. CoC Committee Opportunity

The Collaborative Applicant sent an email on February 27th regarding reestablishing CoC Committee and requesting volunteers for Chair, Vice Chair, or committee members. The CoC intends to send another email in early April to follow up on the matter, including an listing of committee members. The CoC will assist with the initial meeting facilitation or assist in other ways as needed.

2. FEMA Disaster

The Collaborative Applicant is working with the FEMA Disaster Survivor Team to help identify and provide individual assistance to those individuals that are experiencing homelessness that have been affected by the floods during the flood recovery phase. Collaborative applicant has been working closely with Turning Point to identify individuals in need. On March 8th, FEMA will be on site at Human Services Agency (2115 wardrobe Ave.) from 9am to 4pm, along with other community agencies such as DMV and Social Security to facilitate aiding these individuals. There will also be HSA eligibility staff on site. The event is specifically for those residing in non-traditional dwellings, who were homeless prior to the flood, and were affected by the flooding. The goal is to target this specific population who doesn't have access to FEMA and facilitate the connection of services. At this time, 40-50 individuals have been identified. Transportation has been arranged by staff teams at New Direction and Rescue Mission for those in need of it.

XI. CoC General Membership Comments

- Matthew Serratto announced to the group that the State's Clean California week will take place from March 17th through March 27th. During this time, statewide cleanups will be taking place. Serratto states he has partnered with Supervisor Espinosa and will be meeting at Houlihan Park at 9am on March 25th and going through 3pm.
- Gloria Sandoval mentioned concerns over health issues from mold as a result of the recent flooding and advocated to have solutions expedited as a preventative measure. Ceccoli informed that this topic was address at the Board of Supervisors meeting; these issues would be addressed by either Community Economic Development or Environmental Health. State and Federal partners have also stated numerous times that this is going to be 12+ month recovery process.
- Margaret Simmons suggested creating an Outreach Committee. The Collaborative Applicant states this will be added to the next meeting agenda for review and approval.





RECOMMENDED ACTION(S):

Approve the 2023 Point-In-Time count report and authorize the Collaborative Applicant/Administrative Entity to submit this data to the Housing and Urban Development no later than April 28, 2023.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

On February 23, 2023, the Merced County Continuum of Care (CoC) Point-In-Time (PIT) count was completed per the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requirement to identify persons who are meeting the HUD definition of homelessness. During the PIT count, 784 individuals experiencing homelessness were counted. Of those individuals counted, 390 individuals were unsheltered and 394 individuals were defined as sheltered in either transitional housing or emergency shelter.

This count is a decrease of 8.3% or 71 persons from 2022 PIT count. In the 2022 PIT count, there were 855 individuals experiencing homelessness. Of those individuals, 368 were unsheltered and 487 sheltered.

Key highlights in the 2023 PIT count:

- The number of sheltered adults and children in families decreased from 487 in 2022 to 394 in 2023 representing a decrease of 19.1%.
- The number of children experiencing homelessness has decreased by 73 children in 2023.
